THE FRIENDS OF CHELSEA & WESTMINSTER HOSPITAL CHAIR'S REPORT FOR 2022

Introduction

2022 started with great promise that the worst was over, with Covid numbers decreasing rapidly and life beginning to feel normal again. There were still restrictions in the hospital, however, and it wasn't until June, after almost two and a half years of absence, that we were given the go-ahead to bring back our book and bric à brac sales on a limited basis. Traders were also allowed to operate on a reduced schedule.

In April we unfortunately had to cancel our major fundraising event 'An Evening on the Thames'. As you are aware, this was intended to raise funds for 'Best for You', the hospital's landmark project to support child and adolescent mental health. However even without holding the event, through our many generous supporters and a very successful online auction we raised over £15,000. Many thanks to everyone who took part and to all the generous businesses and individuals who donated the wonderful prizes. In particular I would like to thank Jo Soden who put a huge amount of work into planning the event, and Nigel Massey for kindly obtaining many of the auction prizes.

The Best for You project was the main focus of our fundraising during 2022, culminating in our Carol Service on 8th December, with wonderful musical contributions from St Mary the Boltons choral scholars and the return of the hospital's own ChelWest Singers. A special thank you goes to Ana Maria Rincon who performed a John Rutter favourite, 'I Wish You Christmas', and novelist Victoria Hislop, who kindly did one of the readings.

As there were still restrictions on large events in the hospital in December, we were not able to hold a full-scale Christmas Fair. We did however hold two smaller Christmas sales which were well attended

Apart from our usual activities and fundraising there was quite a lot going on behind the scenes in 2022. Very much aware that we needed to recruit more Trustees, Lucy and I spent a lot of time over the summer and autumn months interviewing prospective candidates. I am pleased to say that at this stage we now have three new Committee members (see Trustee News section for more details).

New Services

We were finally given the go-ahead in spring 2022 to reopen the Friends Hair Salon after almost four years of closure. I am delighted to say that following a recruitment process over the summer, 'Alto Hair' is now open for business and is managed by Emma Montalto. Emma brings with her 25 years' experience as a top stylist and hairdressing tutor, and we are very fortunate to have her as part of the Friends team.

With thanks to our longstanding volunteer Nicolas Dreyfus, the Friends are also now running the very popular Staff Lunch Trolley. In partnership with B Bagel (across the road from the hospital) and our own volunteer team, we have brought back this important service for the benefit of busy staff who do not have time to leave their departments for lunch. We are extremely grateful to Nicolas who worked tirelessly to set this project up.

Grants

Grants made in 2022 included £100 to the Maternity Department for a selection of eye masks and

earplugs for patients on the Labour and Postnatal wards. Jointly with CW+ we granted £2,366 to the Outpatients Department for the refurbishment of a changing room for use by hysteroscopy/biopsy patients. Towards the end of the year we granted £1,750 to Interact for their reading service for stroke patients.

Butterfly Rooms

On 16th March 2022 the Friends' executive team visited West Middlesex Hospital for the opening of our four latest Butterfly Rooms. The rooms have already been of great benefit to patients and their families, and the staff have seen first-hand the benefit of a more holistic approach to end-of-life care. Two final Butterfly Rooms were due to be completed by December 2022, but were unfortunately delayed due to winter pressures. However at the time of writing I am glad to say that all rooms are now completed. There are no plans for any further rooms at this stage, so for now the Butterfly Room project has concluded.

Trustee News

We have actively been seeking new Trustees over the past few months, and after a very thorough recruitment process I am delighted that as of the AGM on 17th May we will have three new Trustees - Tom Brown, Lorna MacLean and Becky Riffel - joining us. All three will bring new skills, perspectives and experience to the Management Committee.

Two Trustees have stepped down since the last AGM. Jo Soden, co-vice chair and fundraiser, resigned in February after working tirelessly for five years organising our events. My gratitude and thanks goes to Jo for her total commitment to raising funds for the hospital. Val Thum also sadly stepped down in November 2022. Val has been a stalwart on the committee for many years, and her wealth of fundraising experience has been vital. My thanks to her for her service to the Friends.

Volunteers

Our volunteer team has gone from strength to strength in 2022, with the recruitment of six new Shop and Library Trolley volunteers, as well as a whole new team to run the Staff Lunch Trolley. Many more help out in other ways — manning the book and bric à brac stalls, as well as working behind the scenes tidying the library and fulfilling the increasing number of book requests we receive from patients. We are so grateful to every one of our almost 30 active volunteers for their hard work and dedication.

Staff

Lucy and Richard have worked tirelessly throughout the year supporting the Trustees, volunteers, staff and patients. Both have such different strengths which complement each other. Apart from her administrative responsibilities, Lucy has been a great support in helping prepare and promote our fundraising events, and increasing the Friends' social media profile both inside and outside the hospital. Richard is constantly full of new ideas. Thanks to him and the library team, the sales have bounced back post-covid and are now making upwards of £500 a week for the Friends. We are very fortunate to have two such committed members of staff.

Thank You

I would like to thank the Trustees for all their help and support in 2022, especially Andrew Goodwin, our Treasurer, and Co-Vice Chairs Virginia Morck and Jo Soden. Thank you so much also to Lucy and Richard, as well as all our volunteers - both longstanding team members and new recruits. Finally I would like to thank all our wonderful members and donors, whose generosity makes it possible for our work to continue. Thanks to you all, we are in a very strong position going into our 30th anniversary year of 2023.

THE FRIENDS OF THE CHELSEA & WESTMINSTER HOSPITAL MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE'S REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2022

The Management Committee submits its report and the independently examined financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2022.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

The Friends is an unincorporated association, governed by and registered under the provisions of the Charities Acts. It has a Constitution, registered with the Charity Commission, governing among other things its membership, its objects, the appointment and retirement of officers and members of the Management Committee (the Trustees), its financial organisation and the conduct of committee and general meetings.

The Friends has a Management Committee, among whom are a Chair and two Vice-Chairs. Its day-to-day administration is in the hands of a Charity Manager and a Librarian (See page 1 for details).

Trustees are appointed and elected during the Annual General Meeting.

The Friends raises funds directly through fundraising appeals and charitable trading activities; it also has a wholly owned subsidiary, whose accounts are consolidated with those of the Friends, and through which it carries on commercial trading activities.

OBJECTS, ORGANISATION AND ACTIVITIES FOR THE PUBLIC BENEFIT

The object of the charity is to provide support to patients of the Chelsea and Westminster Hospital NHS Foundation Trust and patients in the wider community. This is largely achieved by giving financial grants to departments for expenditure on equipment and by providing services in aid of the patients. In setting this objective the Management Committee have given careful consideration to the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit.

GRANT MAKING POLICY

The charity invites applications principally from the various medical departments of the hospital. The applicants state the amount required and the purpose for which funds are required. The applications are then reviewed by the Management Committee and either approved, in total or part, or rejected. In addition the charity provides a library and Hair Salon for staff and patients, a trolley service with books and another with goods from the shop for patients on the hospital wards. In 2022 it also introduced a lunch trolley service for staff in partnership with local firm B Bagel.

Grant commitments carried forward at 31 December 2021 were £42,674. Grant commitments made during the year 2022 were £9,886 and £2,558 grants were cancelled, making total grant commitments at the end of 2022 of £7,328. Of these total commitments, £24,775 was paid during 2022, leaving total commitments at 31 December 2022 of £25,227.

As a matter of accounting policy, grants payable are charged in the year when the offer is conveyed to the recipient, so that grants payable at 31 December 2022 appear in the balance sheet of the Friends as "Creditors".

RISK MANAGEMENT

The Management Committee has examined the major strategic, business and operational risks which the charity faces and confirms that systems have been established to enable regular reports to be produced which will assist the Management Committee to monitor and control these risks.

FINANCIAL REVIEW AND INVESTMENT POLICY

2022 continued to be a difficult year for the Charity as Covid restrictions continued to preclude nearly all fundraising activities until the middle of the year. However, we did manage to increase net proceeds to £17,430 up from only £4,368 the preceding year. Of as much importance was the restarting of our important trading activities and we managed to increase revenue from bric-a-brac, book sales and traders licence fees substantially to a total of £9,284. Also, towards the end of the year we launched our bagel trolley which provides a lunch time trolley service to staff who cannot leave the hospital. We expect a significant contribution from this service in 2023.

As a result of these donations and trading activities we managed to continue making grants, albeit on a much-reduced level of £7,328 (2021: £44,317). However, this reduction masks our support of the hospital's "Best for You" project to help adolescents with mental health problems. In 2022 we had made a commitment to raise funds for this project but the exact amount of £50,000 was not formalised until 2023 and this has now been paid and will be reflected in the 2023 accounts.

Given the uncertainty surrounding equity markets and our grant commitments it was felt prudent to raise additional cash and £60,000 was raised during the year. As a result, the group's cash reserves increased to £156,357, thus placing the group in a strong position to retain staff and continue making grants until a full programme of fund-raising activities can resume. Overall net assets declined to £373,267 (2021 £423,580) mainly reflecting a decline in investments of £37,019. Even taking this decline into account the value of our investments was higher than the original cost.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

Details of all the fundraising activities of the Friends are set out in the financial statements, in particular note 2 on page 10. The Friends does not believe it is practical to set financial fundraising objectives in relation to its fundraising activities.

RESERVES POLICY

It has been the policy to maintain funds, which are the free reserves of the charity, at a conservative level as compared with the predicted levels of expenditure. The objective is to provide sufficient funds to cover management, administration and support costs as well as to respond to emergency applications for funding, which arise from time to time.

Unrestricted reserves at 31 December 2022 were £347,908 (2021: £407,992).

PLANS FOR THE FUTURE

Within the scope and framework of its charitable objects and its financial resources, the Friends plan to continue its activities without fundamental change.

At the same time, taking into account anticipated changes in the level and nature of the service offered by Chelsea and Westminster Hospital NHS Foundation Trust, the Friends may adapt some of its fundraising and charitable activities in the future.

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2022

ACCOUNTING CONVENTION

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with applicable UK accounting standards under the historical cost convention, on a going concern basis, as modified by the revaluation of fixed asset investments to market value. The financial statements have been prepared in all significant respects in accordance with the Charities (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2008 and the Statement of Recommended Practice Accounting and Reporting by Charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK (FRS 102) issued on 16 July 2014 and with the Charities Act 2011. There were no departures from that standard.

GROUP FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

The Statement of Financial Activities (SOFA) and balance sheet consolidate the financial statements of the Charity and its subsidiary undertaking, Friends' Shop (C & W) Limited on a line by line basis.

PUBLIC BENEFIT

The Charity constitutes a public benefit entity as defined by FRS 102.

TANGIBLE FIXED ASSETS

Fixed assets are stated at historical cost.

Assets costing more than £400 are capitalised.

Depreciation is provided on all tangible fixed assets at rates calculated to write each asset down to its estimated residual value evenly over its expected useful life as follows:

Office equipment 20% straight line

FIXED ASSET INVESTMENTS

The subsidiary company is included at its equity value based on the company's balance sheet net asset value. Other fixed asset investments are stated at market value at the balance sheet date. Any gain or loss on revaluation is taken to the Statement of Financial Activities.

INCOMING RESOURCES

Entitlement for subscriptions, donations and grants is deemed to be taken when the money is received. Legacies are accounted for when receipt is probable.

Fundraising appeals are recorded in the year in which the event takes place.

Charitable trading activity income is deemed to be taken when the money is received.

Investment income comprises dividend income and bank interest receivable. The income is accounted for on an accruals basis.

RESOURCES EXPENDED

Expenditure is included on an accruals basis.

Costs of generating funds comprise those costs directly attributable to raising funds.

Grants payable are charged in the year when the offer is conveyed to the recipient.

Support costs comprise costs for running the library and other activities and the cost of running the charity. Governance costs comprise costs incurred in the governance of the charity's assets and costs incurred in respect of constitutional and statutory matters.

RESERVES

Reserves comprises of unrestricted general funds and reserved funds.

Reserves are maintained to provide sufficient funds to cover management, administration and support costs as well as to respond to emergency applications for funding, which arise from time to time.

15 TAXATION

No tax charges have arisen in the charity.
